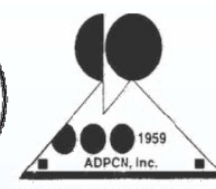

We are seeking research and evidence-based practice abstracts for the 8th International Nursing Conference in Manila, Philippines. Abstract should be 500 words or less in length and provide a brief, clear summary of the research/project/program. Please follow APA format.

No specific application form is required, however poster presentation abstracts should include the following: (1) Title; (2) Problem or Purpose: describing the scope or nature of the problem; (3) Design: For research studies, state the design using appropriate terminology (e.g. descriptive, qualitative, quasi-experimental, experimental, etc.). For Evidence-Based projects, describe whether this was a staff development project, quality improvement project and the process; (4) Setting: Describe the characteristics of participants and participants selections with inclusion/exclusion criteria; (5) Methods: Describe the study/project procedures, interventions, and evaluation methods or data analyses. Instruments or tools should be described; (6) Results/Outcomes: Present the specific data that address your research questions or project purpose. Include statistical data, if appropriate. Evaluate the outcomes of this study/project in relation to the need for this study/project. For research in progress, present the preliminary findings; (7) Implications: How you plan to incorporate the outcomes of your research or evidence project into practice. Please submit your abstract along with your resume or curriculum vitae to Dr. Cecilia Alvarez at espialvarez@hotmail.com by December 15, 2011. All expenses incurred are the responsibility of the presenters. If your poster is accepted, you will be notified by the fourth week of December 2011. We will provide you details in terms of poster requirements.
